

## Five Book marker Patterns



This Daisy Book Marker was made using a size 3.5mm hook, size E US, and regular size worst weight yarn. (10ply)

Ch = Chain

sl st = Slip stitch

DC = Double Crochet

### **Making the Daisy**

With your 3.5 mm hook, ch 5 and sl st into beginning chain to for a ring.

Next Ch 3 and sl st into center of ring (working over your tail) do this 3 more times for a total of 4 small little petals. Now for the next row, you will be working in the back stitches. Ch 4 and then sl st into the back stitch (the sl st from last round)

repeat 3 more times for a total of 4 ch 4 spaces on the back of the flower.

*As shown in picture below.*



Cut yarn and switch to yellow.

Slip stitch your yellow yarn into one of the ch 4 spaces from the previous round. And ch 3 then DC 2 then ch 3 and sl to into ch 4 space. Then sl st into next ch 4 space and repeat for the remaining ch 4 spaces.



Once you get to the end of the round, sl st to small space left from when

you made your first ch 4 and sl st in between the petals (like shown below)



and ch 3, DC 2 ch 3 to add another petal in between. Cut yarn.

Attach your white yarn to the opposite side of where you added the last petal, so you have 3 petals at the top and 2 petals at the bottom.

Attach the yarn in between the two bottom petals and 40 or 45 if yarn is thicker or book your reading is long in length. (This is with regular size paper back in mind.) and on your 40<sup>th</sup> ch pull yarn to leave a loop open to attach the tassel to. *Like shown in picture below.*



## Making the Tassel

Find something that is flat, or cut a piece of cardboard that measures 8cms or 3 inches wide to wrap your yarn around.



Holding on to the tail, wrap your yarn around 10 times (5 times if using two strands of yarn) and cut your yarn on the same side where you started. Now same side cut along the wrapped yarn.



Now lay your yarn out flat and cut another piece of yarn, better to be long than to short, place in the center of the strings of yarn and use it to type them together. Leave this tails at the top as you fold your tails in half.





Now cut another piece of string, again better to have to long than to short, and holding the string with one hand, wrap the yarn around about 4 or 5 times around the top of the tassel to make a head, not to tightly. Tie your string.



Now use your hook to feed these tails through the wrapped string you just tied to make the head.



Attach your original strings to the open chain you left before and tie them all together then feed those tails through the top connection



Cut tail ends to even them out and your done!





For this project you will need a size 3.5mm hook, or size E hook and regular size worst weight (10ply) yarn. You will also need some kind of marker for this project.

Ch = Chain

DC = Double Crochet

sl st = Slip stitch

HDC = Half double Crochet

SC = Single Crochet

sts = Stitches

### **Making the Center of the Flower**

Ch 4 and sl st into beginning ch to form a ring. And ch 1.

#### **Round 1**

SC 8 into center of ring (8 sts) *Place a marker at beginning st and ch 1*

#### **Round 2**

SC 2 into each st around (16 sts) sl to into beginning st, ch 1 and cut yarn.

### Round 3

Now switch to yellow yarn and attach it to any of the sc spaces and ch 6 and DC into the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from hook.



HDC in next st, SC in next st, sl st into last st and the sl st into the following sc space



and ch 6 and repeat.

For a total of 16 petals. Sl st into beginning st and ch 1 & cut yarn.

Change colors to green and attach it to any back of any petal (to hide it)



and chain 40 or 45 if yarn is thicker or book your reading is long in length. (This is with regular size paper back in mind.) and on your 40<sup>th</sup> ch pull yarn to leave a loop open to attach the tassel to.





For this project you will need a size 3.5mm hook, or size E hook and regular size worst weight (10ply) yarn.

Ch = Chain

DC = Double Crochet

sl st = Slip stitch

sts = Stitches

FP = Front Post

### **Making the Flower**

Ch 5 and sl st into beginning ch to form a ring, ch 1

#### **Round 1**

DC 15 into center of ring (15 sts) sl st into beginning st and ch 1 Cut Yarn

#### **Round 2**

Change to white and CH 2 DC 1 in same space, dc 2 in each st around (30 sts) sl st into beginning st and ch 1 cut yarn.



### **Round 3**

Going around the center post with purple, attach yarn on any center Front post and ch 3, skip a post and ch 3 and sl st onto next post repeat for a total of 8 ch 3 spaces. Cut yarn



### **Round 4**

Fasten your purple yarn to one of the outer ring post and ch 3 skip a post and sl st on to next for a total of 15 ch 3 spaces. Cut yarn.

Attach your white yarn to the back bottom of the flower and chain 40 or 45 if yarn is thicker or book your reading is long in length. (This is with regular size paper back in mind.)



and on your 40<sup>th</sup> ch pull yarn to leave a loop open to attach the tassel to.

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For this project your going to need a 4mm hook, a bit of purple, blue, green,

yellow, orange and red regular size worst weight 10 ply yarn and a small piece of card board of something to wrap around to make the tassel.

Ch = Chain

Sc = Single crochet

St(s) = Stitch(es)

## **Making the Rainbow**

### **Round 1 (With Purple)**

ch 8, and sc 1 in second ch from hook, sc in remaining 6 sts ch 1 cut yarn (7 sts)

Take your two purple tails and tie them together to make this side even with the other.

### **Round 2 (with Blue)**

Sc 2 in all sts, ch 1 and cut yarn (14 sts)

Sc in first stitch by attaching the yarn without completing the slip stitch, just pull the yarn up and grab more yarn to complete the sc like shown in picture below.



### **Round 3 ( with Green)**

Sc 1 in the first 4 sts, the sc 2 into the 5<sup>th</sup> st repeat til last st where you will put 2 sc's in the last st. (17 sts) ch 1 and cut yarn

#### **Round 4 (with Yellow)**

Sc 1 in first 6 sts, sc 2 in 7<sup>th</sup> st, repeat til end (19 sts) Ch 1 cut yarn

#### **Round 5 (with Orange)**

Sc 2 in first st, sc 1 in following 6 sts, sc 2 into next repeat until last 4 sts, sc 1 in next 3 sts and then sc 2 into last st (23 sts) ch 1 cut yarn

#### **Round 6 (with red)**

sc 2 into first st, sc 1 into next 6 sts, sc 2 repeat until end, sc 1 into last st. ch 1 cut yarn (26 sts)

Make the tassel and your done!



For this project you will need a 3.5 mm hook and a bit of green, white, black and red regular size worst weight 10 ply yarn.

SC = Single Crochet

CH = Chain

ST(S) = Stitch(es)

## **Making the Watermelon**

### **Round 1**

Ch 4 and sc into the second ch from the hook and sc 1 in the next 2 sts ch 1 and turn (3 sts)

### Round 2

Sc 2 in all sts ch 1 and turn (6 sts)

### Round 3

Sc 2 in first st, ( to sc in first stitch, instead of pulling your yarn through your loop to slip stitch, leave the loop on your hook and pull through both loops like shown below)



sc 1 in the next 4 sts repeat (sc 2, sc 1 in next 4 sts) and once you get to the end and you've done your sc 2 in the last st, the next st your going to put in the last stitch two rows down, put 2 sc's in there. The picture below marks the place where you need to put your two single crochets. ch 1 and turn (10 sts)



#### Round 4

Sc in the first 3 sts, then sc 2 in the next, repeat until you get to the last st, where again you need to go two rows down and put 2 sc's into the last stitch. (14 sts) ( just look at the side stitches and count two rounds down, put two single crochet's in that stitch) ch 1 and turn

#### Round 5

Sc in all sts around, ch 1 and turn (14 sts)

#### Round 6

Sc 2 in first stitch, sc 1 in next 6 sts and repeat, until last 6 sts, you will put sc 1 in the next 5 sts, and 2 sc's in the last st. ch 1 and cut your yarn (17 sts)

Change your color to white

#### Round 7 (with white)

Sc 2 into first st, sc 1 into the next 6 sts then sc 2 (repeat til end of round) ch 1 and cut yarn ( 26 sts) change yarn to green

## Round 8 (with Green)

Sc 2 into first st, sc 1 into the next 6 sts then sc 2 (repeat til end of round) ch 1 and cut yarn (26 sts)

With black yarn to make the seeds, you want to get your tapestry needles and a bit of black yarn and tie a knot in one end of the yarn and thread the other onto your needle, working back and forth through the natural flow of the stitches (remembering it shows on both sides) feed your yarn back and forth through the sts. You can really make your seeds go in any direction you like just be aware it shows through the other side too.



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
